Current Class Action Lawsuits Against Coinbase

1. Coinbase Data Breach Class Action (May 2025)

In May 2025, Coinbase disclosed a significant data breach involving rogue overseas contractors who stole sensitive customer data for cybercriminals. The compromised information includes customer names, addresses, emails, Social Security numbers, bank account details, and images from government-issued IDs. As a result, attorneys are gathering individuals affected by the breach to take legal action via mass arbitration, which is different from a class action lawsuit. Affected individuals may be entitled to compensation under state consumer protection and privacy laws. 2. Sweepstakes Class Action Settlement (\$2.25 Million)

Coinbase settled a class action lawsuit for \$2.25 million over a sweepstakes that allegedly failed to adequately disclose a free entry method. The lawsuit claimed that Coinbase and its promotions agency violated California consumer protection laws, including the False Advertising Law and the Unfair Competition Law.
